

## MASTER OF DIVINITY (M.Div.) PROGRAM

---

### 1. Goals of the Program

---

- a. To help the student to apply a consistent, dispensational approach when interpreting the Scriptures and applying them to his own life and the lives of others.
- b. To train the student to make appropriate use of available linguistic tools to secure most accurate understanding of scriptures possible.
- c. To help the student to possess a store of biblical facts as a foundation for personal development, teaching and further study.
- d. To train the student in the methodology of research and in the written presentation of his research.

### 2. Admission Requirements for Theological Graduates

---

- a. Experience of conversion to Christ.
- b. A definite call for full-time ministry.
- c. An instinct to learn Greek and Hebrew.
- d. A bachelor degree in Theology with C+ grade (75%).
- e. A pass in an entrance examination in Theology, Greek, and English with C+.

### 3. Admission Requirements for Secular Graduates

---

- a. Experience of conversion to Christ.
- b. A definite call for full-time ministry.
- c. An instinct to learn Greek and Hebrew.
- d. A secular degree with a second class.
- e. A pass in an entrance examination in the following areas:
  - Bible Knowledge
  - Christian Experience
  - Proficiency in English Language

### 4. Medium of Study

---

M.Div. is offered only in English medium.

### 5. Duration of the Program

---

The duration of the course is two years.

### 6. Graduation Requirements

---

- a. Successful completion of 80 credits of course work for theological graduates; Successful completion of 100 credits of course work for secular graduates. Each credit amounts to 16 class hours consisting of 50 minutes and 32 hours of research. Thus, a four credit course involves 64 hours of class room study and 128 hours of research.
- b. An assessment of Field education involvement. Field education assists students to learn about the practice of ministry through direct involvement in the assembly assigned, under the direction of the Academic Dean. Students are required to complete two years of planned, supervised, and evaluated field education in a setting approved by the Academic Dean.
- c. Successful completion of an approved thesis of not less than 20,000 words.
